The Chicago Section is one of the most active and well respected in the ACS, and in recent years it has made excellent progress in communication with its membership; providing improved options, such as virtual technologies, for its monthly meetings; emphasizing its commitment to diversity and inclusiveness among its volunteers and leaders; recognizing the contributions of its members to the field of chemistry and to the ACS; and receiving ChemLuminary Awards from the ACS for its achievements. The Section should continue its work in these areas, with a particular focus on communications and interactions with chemists who work at local colleges and universities, elementary schools and high schools, and government and industrial laboratories, to learn more about how the Section can provide services our members and the public need. The Section can build on its new strategic plan to enhance its effectiveness, and the Section can continue to use the Chemical Bulletin, the Section web site and social media for communicating with its membership. In the coming years as we recover from the Covid-19 pandemic, the need for career advice and assistance among our members will be greater than it has been for many years. We will need to emphasize outreach activities such as National Chemistry Week, the Illinois State Fair, and Chemists Celebrate Earth Day to nurture growth in public interest and awareness of the benefits chemistry offers to humankind to meet global challenges. More than ever, chemistry, and indeed all science, is a global enterprise, and the Section should explore options for partnering with other local sections and with ACS International Chapters in areas of common interest. In August, 2022, the ACS National Meeting will once again return to Chicago. This meeting, with its theme of Sustainability in a Changing World, will provide an excellent opportunity for the Section to celebrate its achievements, illustrate the excitement of chemistry, and talk about the many contributions Chicago chemists have made to advance scientific knowledge and improve the lives of its citizens.

COVID had a tremendous impact on the Chicago Section, which has a tradition of face-to-face dinner meetings at least once a month throughout the academic year and also hosting events at the State Fair with other sections during the summer. During 2020, we supported our members by holding our general and board meetings by Zoom. We also continued to enhance our Section newsletter: The Chemical Bulletin; a summary is attached because of its tremendous value to our members during this difficult year. Although we cancelled the March meeting, our ongoing virtual meetings actually showed improved attendance. For example, our April Zoom meeting, brought in over 100 participants, compared to a normal face-to-face meeting of 30-60! Our Gibbs Meeting had over 150 participants from around the world. Recognizing the need to meet face-to-face on a regular basis, we used our 2020 experience to learn how to improve a remote meeting experience for participants in the Section and beyond. 2020 was also special for the Section because: 1. It was our 125th birthday (1895-2020). We had planned for a big party but instead celebrated with a talk on "125 Years of Chemistry in Chicago" at our September meeting. 2. We reorganized our governance to improve communication, impact, and participation opportunity for our members in 2019. We updated our Bylaws accordingly. Our new Bylaws were approved in December and we now have begun in 2021 with the new operating structure completely operational. We are now organized into five divisions: Administration, Communication, Education & Outreach, Membership, and Science. Each division is chaired by an individual, who holds joint committee meetings to coordinate and refine joint functions. One committee that was particularly effective at this was the Communication Division. Prior to our new structure, one or two people were primarily in charge of all communication. Now a team spreads out the work with a program manager who facilitates communication to make sure that everyone has done their assignment. The process for posting information in a timely manner improved substantially in 2020 due to a much higher level of coordination. As a bonus, we now have more membership actively engaged. We are also improving the effectiveness of our office staff person, who by doing many of the routine tasks frees-up time for our member volunteers to focus on strategy, program, communications, and events. Our YCC and WCC groups had a particularly strong year with eight programs. These programs strengthened relationships with two student groups from outside the Section and were co-hosted with the St. Louis and Nashville Sections. These groups also did an outstanding job of promoting the National ACS Webinars appropriate for their constituents. An IPG facilitated our Outreach Committee as the first of three experimental kits/videos were distributed to 50 K-12 teachers for NCW. Once the schools had sent their students home due to the pandemic, CCEW handed out 3000 activity bags containing the CCEW magazine and some at-home activities/supplies while also posting videos online for parents and teachers to use for their kids.
